The industrial revolution which was started in England, also reached India, because India was a

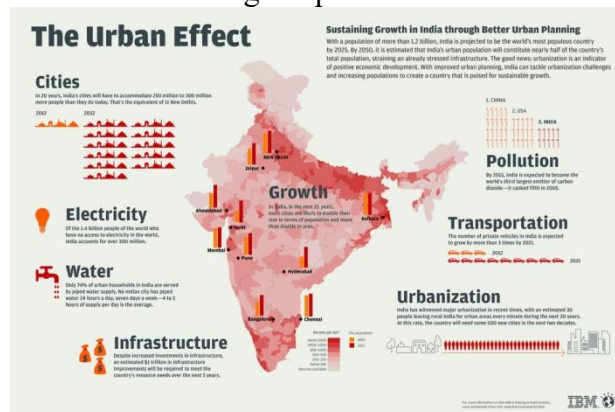
colony of England.
